Ending homelessness in Calgary

- 6,663 people counted as homeless in 1st 7 Cities PIT Count
 - Homelessness decreased 15% in Alberta 2008-2014
- 3,555 people counted as homeless in Calgary
 - 15% decrease in Calgary per 100,000 pop 2008-2014

- 895 people placed in housing
 - Funding provided to 60 programs delivered by 27 agencies
 - 39 programs provided 2,231 housing spaces with supports

Supporting client success through front-line agencies

- Coordinated 45 training programs for community
 - 1,153 front-line participants
- Tapped experts from 13 agencies to facilitate training programs
- Decreased administrative burden on agencies
 - RFP process simplified
 - Streamlined process for Key Measurement Indicators

 Enhanced communication with agencies and timely feedback on program performance; support success & apply learnings

Evidence and Outcomes-based decision making

- Developed and refined Key Performance Indicators
- Developed and implemented
 Performance Scorecard
 - Peer-to-peer evaluations

- Adjusted program funding based on performance
- Hard decisions made (transition plans for all affected, no return to homelessness)
- Used data to identify gaps in System of Care
- Advocated for and funded gaps
 - ie. CUPS Couples programming with Key Case Management
